About the Artist

Marci Nadler is an artist residing and working on a farm in the foothill Piedmont area of the Blue Ridge Mountains of Virginia.

Nadler states: "I am endlessly inspired by the dramatic skies, and the constantly changing landscape of the Virginia countryside — the colors of the grasses and fields of wildflowers against the enormous, moody sky, masses of flashing fireflies in the fields, cows huddled under shady trees — transcendental moments wherever you turn. On a non-visual level, I am inspired by the local talent, and the sense of caring community."

Her work has won many awards and is in private collections throughout the U.S. Her paintings have also been exhibited at American embassies overseas, through the Art in the Embassies program, in such places as La Paz, Bolivia, and Riyadh, Saudi Arabia.

Nadler is a member of Artists in Middleburg, the Middleburg Arts Council, and is a long-standing member of the National Society of Arts and Letters, a non-profit organization that supports and encourages young artists in all of the genres. As a member, she has run several of the visual art competitions to assist young talent.
